Old Business -

1) Thresher Service - Jack McNally has been in touch with the Elk's Club and the issue at hand is when to hold the Service. It will need to be Saturday, April 7 or 14. It is suggested to go with the furthest date to allow for better weather and allow time for invitations. Kevin will get in touch with John Cook. Suggestion to send out a flyer using our database to help with turnout. A reason to shifting off base was to allow for more public attendance we need to look at other media sources. Looking at holding the 45th to be on base. Apparently Easter is on the 8th, so we will go with the 14th.




To Perpetuate the Memory



Francis Michael Cummings was born on May 31, 1936, in Newton, Mass. He spent his early boyhood there, and was graduated from Wellesley High School in June 1954.

Francis enlisted in the Navy in July, and after completing his recruit training, he volunteered for submarine duty.

He was accepted for training, and entered the Navy's Submarine School at the U.S. Naval Submarine Base, New London, Conn. He completed the course and was graduated with the class of March 1955. His first assignment was in the submarine U.S.S. Harder (SS 568), followed by a tour of duty in the U.S.S. Blenny (SS 324). Francis became qualified

as a submariner while serving in the Harder on July 16, 1956.

Selected for sonar training, Francis attended the school at Key West, Fla., and at the Raytheon Co. in Burlington, Mass. In May 1961, he reported for duty as a member of the crew of the nuclear-powered submarine U.S.S. Thresher (SSN 593). During his naval service, Francis had been awarded the Navy's Good Conduct Medal.

He is survived by his widowed mother, Mrs. Helen C. Cummings; brothers, Thomas J., and Paul T.; sisters, Mrs. Mary Ellen Laak of Berkeley, Calif.; and Elizabeth A. Cummings of Wellesley, Mass.

Samuel Joseph Dabruzzi was born on August 27, 1936, in Hudson, Wis., the son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Dabruzzi. He attended St. Patrick's Grade School and upon being graduated in 1950, received the coveted American Legion Award for scholarship and leadership. His first 2 years of high school were spent at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Worthington, Ohio. He returned to Hudson High School and was graduated with the class of 1954. Samuel attended St. Thomas College in St. Paul, Minn., for 2 years prior to enlisting in the Navy in September 1956.


He received his basic training at the U.S. Naval Training Center, Great Lakes, Ill., and attended the Navy's Electronics technician School in San Francisco, Calif. He then volunteered for submarine duty and upon being accepted he enrolled in the Submarine

school at the U.S. Naval Submarine Base, New London, Conn. He was graduated in January 1959, and was selected for advance training. He completed the course in nuclear power at the submarine base and at the nuclear-power training unit at West Milton, N.Y. On February 27, 1961, Samuel was assigned to the U.S.S. Thresher (SSN 593). during his naval service, Samuel had been awarded the Navy's Good Conduct Medal, and a letter of commendation from the commanding officer of the U.S.S.

Thresher (SSN 593) for his outstanding performance of duty.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs.

Carrie Ann; three children, Samuel, Jr., Carl James, Vivian Ann; brothers, Frank, Albert, and the Very Reverend James S. Dabruzzi; five sisters, Mrs. John Zappa, Mrs. Donald Hentges, Mrs. Joseph Mezzenga, Mrs. James Meyer, and Doris Dabruzzi.
